A Visit to Liverpool



Monday 21 - Thursday 24 March 2022

The wealth of history and cultural heritage to explore in Liverpool is astonishing. From the industry of the Albert Dock to the dramatic modern architecture of the Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King to the works of Rubens, Rembrandt and Poussin housed in the Walker Art Gallery, it is a city brimming with impressive art and architecture. Our tour will highlight the very best Liverpool and the surrounding region has to offer.



MONDAY 21 MARCH 2022

We will depart from our local pick up point, at the top of Parry's Lane, and travel by coach to

Wolverhampton for a visit to Wightwick Manor and Gardens (National Trust). This Victorian manor house, located on Wightwick Bank, is one of only a few surviving examples of a house built and furnished under the Arts and Crafts Movement. Acquired by the National Trust in 1937, the house now contains a wonderful collection of Pre-Raphaelite paintings by Rosetti, Burne-Jones and their followers. Please note that there will be a short walk from the coach to the house. Lunch may be taken on an individual basis during our free-flow visit.

This afternoon we will continue to **Liverpool**, where we will check in to the 4 star **Jurys Inn Liverpool Hotel** for 3 nights' bed and breakfast accommodation.

After a little time to freshen up, **dinner** will be served in the hotel restaurant.

TUESDAY 22 MARCH 2022

After breakfast at the hotel we will meet our **local guide** and embark on a full day of visits in **Liverpool**, beginning with a **guided visit** of **St George's Hall**.

Designed by Harvey Lonsdale Elmes and opened in 1854, St George's Hall is one of the best assembly halls in England and represents the prosperity of Liverpool in the 19th century. We will stop for **coffee** at perhaps the most ornate pub in England, the dazzling and flamboyant **Philharmonic Public House**. It was commissioned between 1898 and 1900 and features an extremely ornate Art Deco interior. Further exploration of the heart of the city tour will uncover an array of wonderful architecture revealing the past wealth of this prosperous city. We will continue with a visit to the **Metropolitan**

Cathedral of Christ the King, a very modern cathedral built in a dramatic circular style with a multi-coloured glass lantern tower bathing the interior in a pool of light. Our visit will include access to Lutyens' Crypt, the only part of the Cathedral built to Lutyens' grand designs, to rival St Peter's Basilica in Rome, which proved too costly.

There will be free time for lunch.

This afternoon we will visit the largest Anglican cathedral in Britain, the neo-gothic **Liverpool Cathedral**. Designed by Sir Giles Gilbert Scott, the cathedral holds an important collection of church embroidery.

Our final visit this afternoon will be the **Walker Art Gallery**. Founded in 1873 by Sir Andrew Barclay

Walker, a local brewer and Mayor of Liverpool, this
gallery houses one of the finest art collections in the

North. Paintings range from early Italian and Flemish
works to Rubens, Rembrandt, Poussin, and French

Impressionists such as Degas' *Women Ironing*. Among the
strong collection of British artists from the 18th century
onwards are works by Millais, Turner and Gainsborough.

We will return to our hotel for an evening at leisure.
Independent arrangements for dinner.

WEDNESDAY 23 MARCH 2022

After breakfast at the hotel, we will travel by coach to the seaside town of Great Crosby, where we will view a piece of modern sculpture, 'Another Place', by Antony Gormley. The sculpture consists of 100 cast iron figures, which are replicas of the artist's own body looking out to sea, spread over a 2 mile stretch of beach. As the tide ebbs and flows, so the figures emerge and submerge in the water. We will continue to **Port Sunlight village** at Bebington. William Hesketh Lever came to the Wirral area looking for a suitable site to build a new factory for his expanding soap business. His vision was to build not only the factory, but also houses for his workers. The construction of Port Sunlight village began in 1889 with 28 houses, and eventually grew to 800 houses by 1914. Today we see the picturesque garden village, named after Lever's famous Sunlight soap, which is now a conservation area and tourist attraction, featuring the Lady Lever Art Gallery as its centrepiece.

On arrival at Port Sunlight, there will be an introduction from a local guide followed by a coach tour of the village. This will be followed by a free-flow visit of the Lady Lever Art Gallery, which is named in memory of Lord Leverhulme's late wife. The

magnificent collection boasts romantic masterpieces by the great Pre-Raphaelites including Burne-Jones and Rossetti, and dramatic landscape paintings by Constable and Turner. In addition, the gallery houses Chippendale furniture, sculpture, tapestries, delicate Chinese porcelain and English Wedgwood. The new South End galleries have recently re-opened following a £2.8million major development project including the Chinese Rooms - two interlinked rooms demonstrating the importance and influence of Chinese ceramics on European art and taste. During the visit lunch may be taken in the gallery café. This afternoon we will return by coach to central Liverpool and there will be some free time in the city for independent exploration.

This evening **dinner** will be taken in a local restaurant.

Please note that the order of visits will be subject to change, and is dependent upon tide times

THURSDAY 24 MARCH 2022

We will check out of the hotel after breakfast and travel to Stoke-on-Trent a visit to local pottery manufacturer, Middleport Pottery. World famous Burleigh pottery has been created here using traditional methods since 1889. Much of the original machinery and processes are still used today. Unique to 'Burleigh' is the process of underglaze tissue printing, creating patterns using handengraved copper rollers. We will be met on arrival by a resident guide for a factory tour and a tour of the Pottery's Heritage, including the Victorian Offices, Grade II* listed bottle kiln and Europe's largest ceramic design archive.

A **light lunch** will be served in the Pottery Tearooms. This afternoon we will continue our homeward journey to our original pick-up point, at the top of Parry's Lane.

Please note as this tour has been planned many months in advance, and due to the various Covid-19 related measures and restrictions that may be in place at the time of your visit, the final itinerary may vary slightly from the above.

This tour involves a considerable amount of walking and standing and may not be suitable for those with mobility issues.
